

## **Field Day on Weed Management in your Forest: Start to Finish Saturday, April 7 (8:30am-4:30pm)**

Meet at the Clackamas Community College parking lot east of Clairmont Hall by 8:30am.

Weed control is often the key to success or failure in establishing trees and maintaining tree growth. This field tour will cover principles and practices of vegetation management for establishing and maintaining trees in forestry and forest restoration. Key topics include vegetation management with herbicides, non-chemical methods and integrated pest management approaches for selecting and combining methods. Field sites will feature common situations and important weeds that compete for site resources.



The goal is to help you to plan and implement site-specific management strategies for the long-term success of your trees. The tour will be led by Glenn Ahrens, OSU Extension Forester (soon to be your forester for Clackamas/Marion/Hood River Co.) along with Michael Ahr, Forest Conservationist, West Multnomah SWCD; Bruce Kelpsas, Vegetation Management Specialist, Helena Chemical Co.; and Mike Haasken, Oregon Department of Forestry.
