- 5) What pests does it control?
- 6) What are the active ingredients and their concentrations?
- 7) Are there other ingredients? If so, what are they?
- 8) Are there hazards to humans indicated for this pesticide? If so, what are they?
- 9) Is there a signal word for this product?
- 10) Is there personal protective equipment required for users of this product?
- 11) If I get this pesticide in my eyes, what should I do?
- 12) Are there any environmental hazards indicated for this product? If so, what are they?
- 13) Are there any chemical or physical hazards for this pesticide? If so, what are they?
- 14) If I spray my spinach with this pesticide, how soon can I harvest it?
- 15) My kale bed is 4 ft x 20 ft. How much water and how much Monterey Garden Insect Spray should I use to spray the bed?
- 16) How many times each season can I spray my avocado tree?
- 17) How soon after I spray my lawn can the kids and pets go out to play on it?
- 18) My cat has fleas that have become a problem in the house. Can I use this pesticide indoors?
- 19) The container only has a little bit left in it and I want to put the rest in a smaller container and use this container for something else. Is that okay to do?
- 20) I decided this pesticide is not for me, but the container is still half full. Is it okay to pour it down the kitchen sink?
