Lady Bug Landing Garden Report 10/24

The garden is starting to wind down at Lady Bug Landing. We had Tomato Blight go through the garden the end of last week and so all the gardeners are removing their plants, it is always sad to see all those dead tomato plants. There are still gardens that have some fall veggies but with the tomatoes being removed a lot of beds are done for the season. The garden closes on December 1 for the year and we will do a work party the first Saturday in December, we clean up and put lime on all the beds. Gardeners are responsible for cleaning their own plots and putting a light dressing of straw on. Lady Bug Landing will start taking applications again January 3. The demo beds have produced a lot of food to the Food Bank, 890 pounds so far this season. The demo beds that have finished have had a cover crop of Buckwheat put on them with helps bring phosphorous into the soil, we will be turning some of that in this week as it starts to flower. The affected gardeners lost lots of tomatoes. Something to keep and eye on next year. The garden has been donating tomatoes and cucumbers to the Lakeside Library and north Bend Senior Center.
