On August 16, from 10:30-noon we have The Beet Food Systems is doing another program at the garden, the first program was very successful. This workshop will be two programs again, 1. Incorporating Mushrooms into your Garden, 2. Cover Crops and Winter Protection. The program is free you just need to register for them at thebeetfsc.org. We have been harvesting lots of food in our demo beds, this last week was zucchinis cucumbers, beans, onions, potatoes, leeks, and lettuce.
