**School Garden Grants:** Myrtle Point's Maple Middle School received a grant of \$821.30 for a school garden. They made planter boxes and benches. 8 students and 2 teachers were involved.

Myrtle Crest Elementary received a grant of \$1,300 to clear up walking path around the greenhouse. They replaced the old landscape cloth and put down new bark chips.

Powers received a grant of \$959.

**Oregon Master Gardeners Association-**Mary Dixon: Dr. Madsen talked about volunteer hours reported for the year statewide. The numbers are good. OMGA reps sent to a recent senate meeting and spoke with senators about the value of our program. Senate bill 2027 is a budgetary one that has implications for a variety of things including Extension and the MG program.

Joy of Gardening is July 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>. Can go online to see what classes are available. Registration opens the 1<sup>st</sup> week of April. There are grants available to send a friend to Joy of Gardening. There is up to \$1,000 available. This for classes only. Dorm rooms are available at \$40 a night. Each unit contains 3 bedrooms, a kitchen and 2 bathrooms.

Seed to Supper discussion. The curriculum is not complete. There is problem of how to reach out.

Considering making the yearly Master Gardener of the year award into one award instead of 3 separate awards.

There are 20 longevity awards for 20 years of volunteer service. The average span is 2- 3 years in various areas of volunteerism.

Other awards-the Carl Carlson grant for urban horticulture has increased from \$250 to \$1,000. Mary Luce-Search of excellence is just an award. Not monetary.

There was also much discussion about the criteria need to evict contentious, aggressive or otherwise disruptive members that won't play nice. CCMGA does have a code of conduct in place.

## **Sam's February Coordinators Report:**

We will have an intern, Zaidee Quinn who is attending SWOCC and enrolled in the new Agroecology program. She needs 99 hours of volunteer work during the term.

We will no longer turn off the computer in the Plant Clinic as it takes too long to boot up. The password has been updated. If you are working the Plant Clinic, be sure to check voice mail, email and also the open cases book for anything that needs completing.

Fertilize Your Mind- All classes are set. Currently 35 people are registered. Hoping for 100. Received a \$1,500 grant from Coos Rotary. Nurseries that will be present are Sea Coast, Coos Garden Supply and Thyme Garden. All 15 tables are full. They will include Beekeepers Association, Native Plant Society, Master Gardeners and Master Food Preservers.
