Power washing inside the greenhouse

We had work parties at the greenhouse in Nov and on Dec 9th. We had about 12 volunteers come each time, ready and willing to do the hard work of getting the greenhouse ready for winter/spring planting.

We: took the cover (shade cloth) off the greenhouse and rolled it up

tightened the skin of the greenhouse where it was loose

installed new shut off valves for the hoses

soaked all the trays (many hundreds of them) in bleach water for 20 minutes

pulled weeds that were growing in the greenhouse, then swept the greenhouse

moved all the heavy tables so they could be power washed from all angles;

power washed the tables

sprayed, with a back pack sprayer, all the tables from all angles with a bleach water solution and left them to dry

It was hard and heavy work. Before we could begin the work that day, we found that we had no water, and that the water system needed to be repaired. The guys worked on that, mending hoses, repairing and buying and installing new fixtures. Once water was flowing we could start spraying the tables and dipping all those trays. We still have electrical work to do as we could only use one sprayer or vacuum at a time, or the fuses would blow. But this will wait for the time being. Now we are ready for January and for the work of planting to begin in February.

Thank you all for the warm welcome you have given me, and I will do my best to fill the big shoes that I will need to fill in this position.
