Beavers are nature's construction crew!
Beavers chew through trees and bushes so
they can use the wood to build their homes on
top of water. These homes are called dams. Dams
help keep beavers safe from predators that live
on land. Dams also act like walls, causing water
to build up behind them.



When Beavers Leave
Unfortunately, some areas
lose their active beaver
communities due to things like
human construction, trapping,
and changes to the water.
When places lose beavers,
they lose other plants
and animals too.
It is important when
changing outside
areas to make sure
local beavers are
protected.

Beavers have a green paw

This built-up water floods the land near the dam creating new areas for water-loving plants to grow. Because of beavers' great building skills, areas with beaver dams have more unique plants compared to areas without dams.
