Loxodonta africana

Because they are so big, they have to eat around 350 lbs of foliage every day. They spend about 18 hours each day eating!

Wild Diet: herbivores (plant-eaters):

COMMUNICATION:

They make a low rumbling sound, which vibrates the ground.

They use these vibrations to talk to other elephants!

TRUNK:

Contains more than 40,000 muscles! Used for drinking, grasping, communicating, and even self-defense. The tip of their trunk, known as their "finger", allows them to grab small objects and feel texture (like your fingers!) but also scents and vibrations.

BEHAVIOR:

Intelligent, curious, and caring, with a strong sense of memory.

EARS:

They help cool themselves in the hot African climate (measure 6 ft across)!
