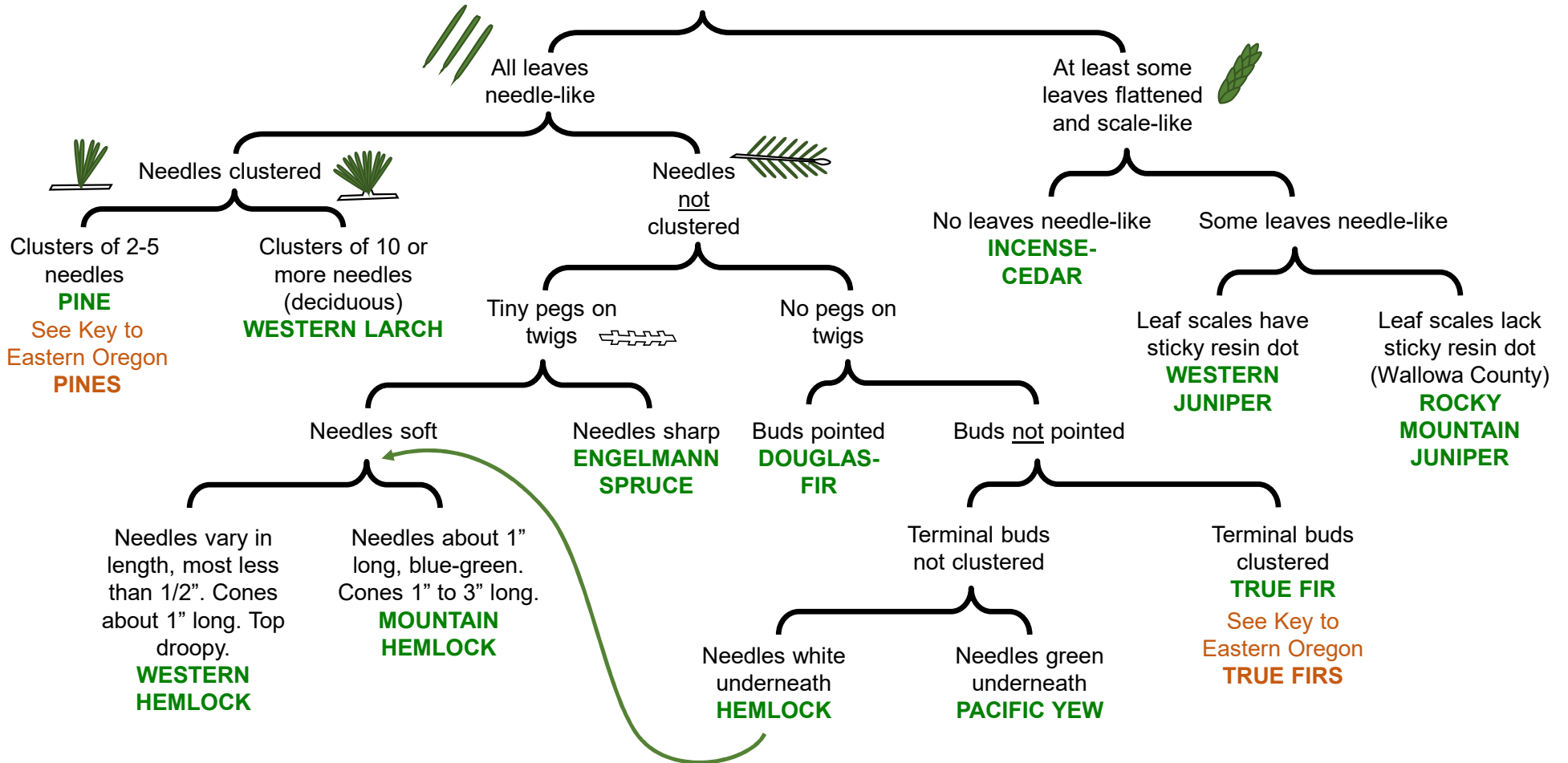

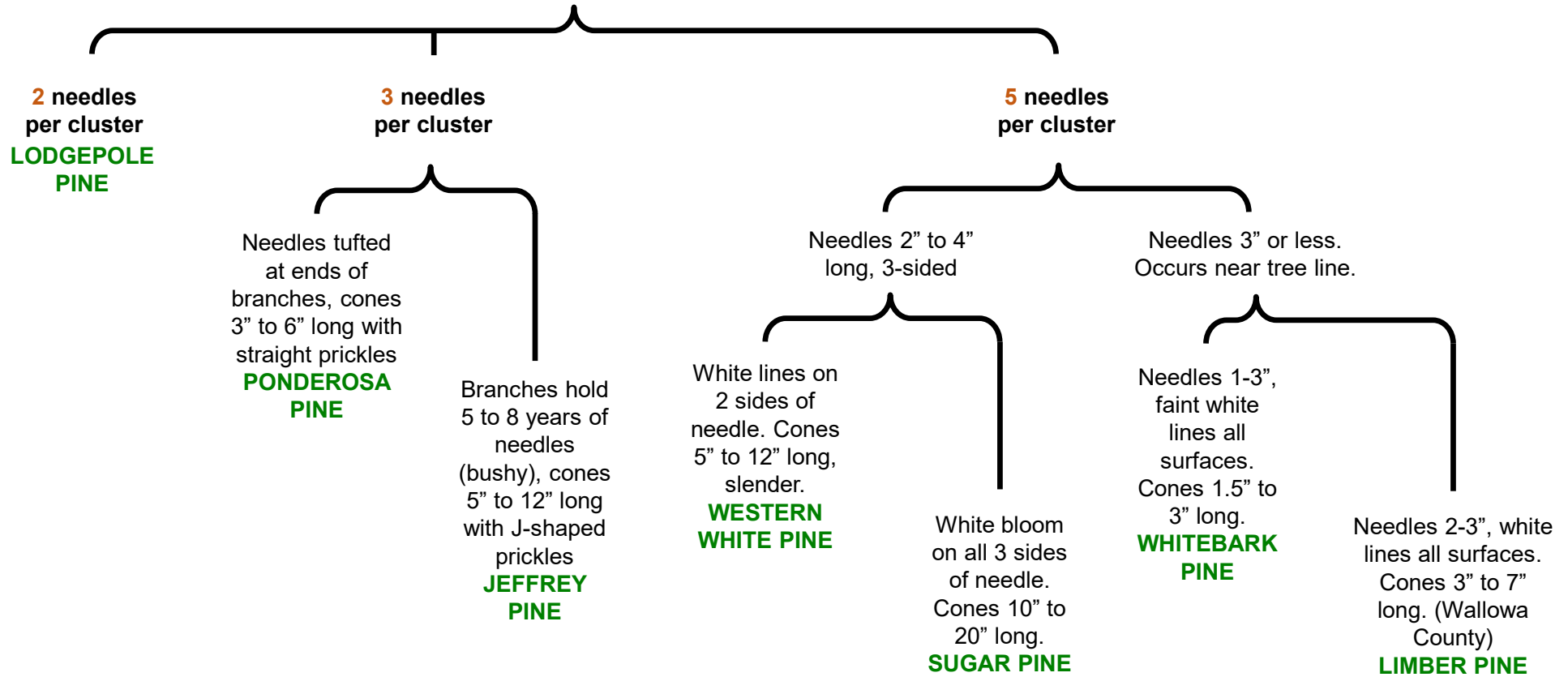

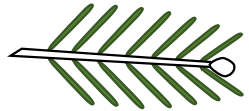
Key to Eastside Oregon Pines



Needles in clusters of 5 or less

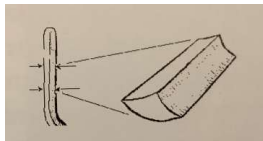
Key to Eastside Oregon True Firs

- All leaves needle-like
- Needles not clustered
- Needles not sharp
- Leaf edges not rolled under
- Buds not pointed
- Upright cones

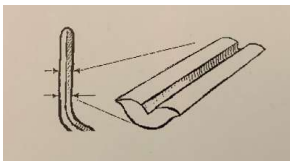
Needles on underside of twig shaped like hockey sticks (base parallels twig). New twigs **brown**.

Leaves straight, flat, base does not parallel twig. New twigs **green**.

Upper surface of needle has ridge. Cones lack papery bract.
CALIFORNIA RED FIR



Upper surface of needle has groove. Cones have papery bract.
NOBLE FIR



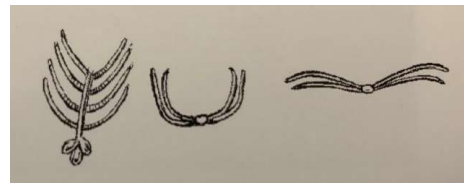
Bloom on needles' upper surface

No bloom on needles' upper surface

Needles 1" long (or less)
SUBALPINE FIR
(Small tree, near treeline)



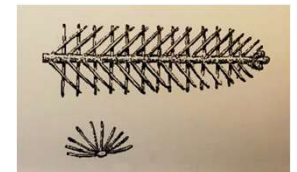
Needles 2" to 3" long
WHITE FIR
(Large tree, middle elevations)



All needles point to sides, in two distinct rows (flat or V-shaped)
GRAND FIR



Topmost needles point forward
PACIFIC SILVER FIR
